

Installation Aftercare Advice

Steps for lighting a perfect fire

- Place a couple of Flamers on the stove base/grid.
- Build a Jenga tower about 4-5 levels high with your kindling.
 - Place a log on top of the jenga tower.
 - Make sure the stove air vent(s) are fully open.
- Ignite the Flamers in a safe way and push the door to.
- You should then have a nice hot start to your fire. Adjust stove air vents as required and add new log as and when required.

On 1st firing/burn, there will be a smoke like haze with a smell accompanied by it. This will be the stove paint curing. No need to panic, as explained just leave the door and windows ajar and it will disperse. It will only happen once, and then should be fine after that.

Always keep a small bed of ash when starting a new fire.

Purchase a moisture meter to guarantee that the wood moisture content is 20% or under.

This is the correct guideline for wood burning.

Do NOT burn fresh cut or wet wood.

When buying wood, look for the 'Ready to Burn' logo.

An easy, quick hack to clean your glass on your stove. Wet some newspaper, dip it in the ash and rub over the glass.

The ash acts as a natural mild abrasive and cleans the glass.

Your chimney/flue should be swept by a fully qualified sweep at least once per burning year cycle.

Test your Carbon Monoxide Alarm weekly.

When your chimney/flue is not in use the air will be cold. Cold air is heavier than hot and will need heat to disperse. That is why it is vital to start your fire correctly to generate a decent amount of heat.

If your fire doesn't burn hot enough to begin with, you could end up with smoke coming back down the chimney/flue and exiting the stove via door seals or air vents.

So just make sure you use Flamers (firestarters), dry kindling and dry wood. I'm sure you are using your moisture to double check your wood reading by now...and your wood is reading...yes you got it 20% or under.
