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	New Garden	Established Garden
 Potting Mix	Mix 10 – 30% parts Worm Castings to soil.	Add 1" of Worm Castings to top of soil. Mix in taking care not to damage shallow roots – water – repeat every 2-3 months.
 Vegetable and Annual Flowers	Line bottom and sides of plant holes and seed furrows with thin layer of Worm Castings. Set seeds or plants in place and cover with soil. Side dress during growing season at a rate of ½ cup per plant or 1 cup per linear foot in a row every 2 months.	Apply 3 gallons (approximately 15lbs) per 1000 sq. ft. as a top dressing. Sprinkle on soil near plant and water. For potted plants, window boxes or hanging baskets use 1-3 tablespoons of castings around the base of each plant, or up to a cup if it's a large plant.
 Perennials	Work ½ cup Worm Castings into the soil above the plant's root zone, taking care not to damage shallow roots. Apply in spring, early summer and early fall.	Work ½ cup Worm Castings into the soil above the plant's root zone, taking care not to damage shallow roots. Apply in spring, early summer and early fall.
 Roses Trees, Shrubs, and Berries	Mix 2-parts of Worm Castings to 3 parts soil. Surround newly-dug hole with mixture.	Use 1 ½ quarts (approximately 1 ½ lbs) of Worm Castings per inch of tree trunk diameter. Spread evenly over tree root area and water. Consider applying as tea mixture.
 Lawns	Apply 5 gallons (approximately 25lbs) per 1000sq. ft. Work lightly into the topsoil. Mix in grass seed and water thoroughly.	Apply 3 gallons (approximately 15lbs) per 1000 sq. ft. as a top dressing. Water the lawn thoroughly after application. Repeat every 5-6 weeks during growing season.
