- If the IC has a fictitious or assumed business name.
- How the IC's business is structured (as a Sole Proprietorship, partnership, corporation, or limited liability company, for example).
- The IC's business address and phone number
- The number of people employed by the IC, if any.
- Any professional or business license the IC holds.
- Contact information for other companies

- for whom the IC has worked as an Independent Contractor.
- How the IC markets his or her business (for example, online advertising).
- Whether the IC has an office separate from his or her home.
- A description of the business equipment and facilities the IC owns.
- Whether the IC has business cards, professional stationery, and invoice forms.
- A list of all of the types of insurance that the IC carries.
- Eligibility to work in the United States.
